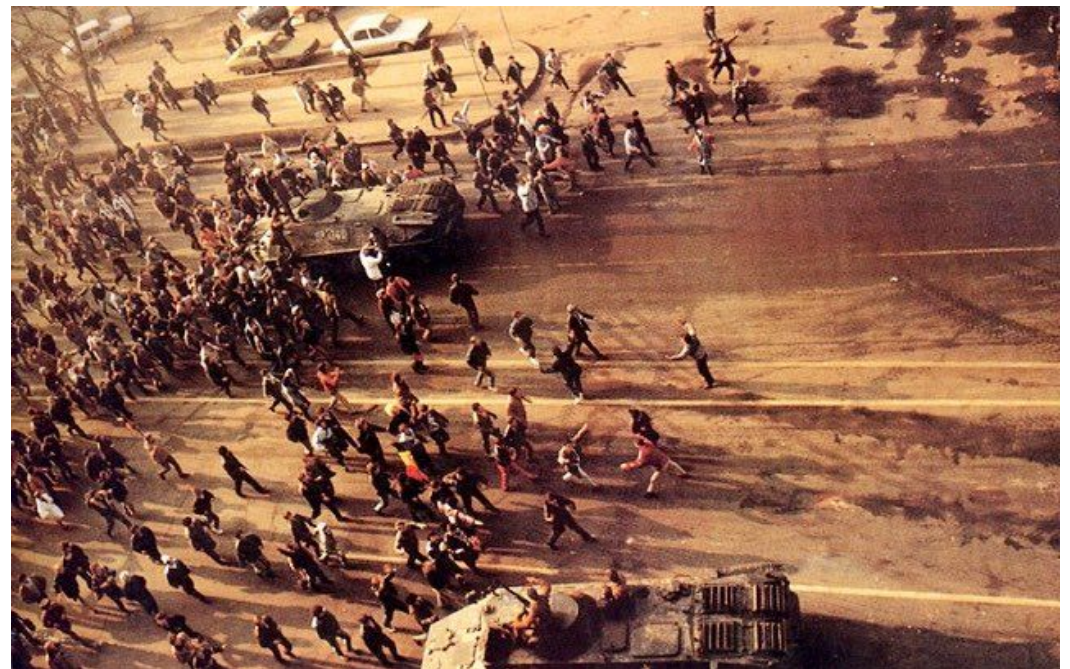






# 1989 Romanian revolution

- **Who? How?**

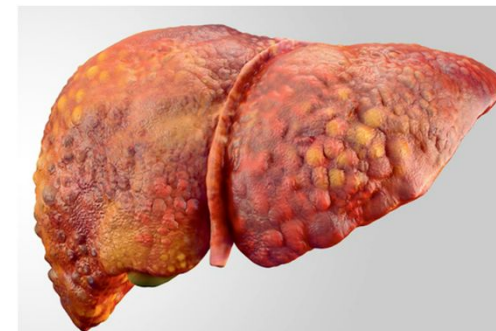
